#### Our Home, Our Future, Our Time – NEWS & NOTES

Campaign "visits" are underway! We hope you will embrace the opportunity to get to know another church member better, and to share your hopes and dreams for the church and this Campaign. Rest assured, this visit is not about asking you for money...that is entirely up to you to know and decide! If you haven't been contacted about a visit, and

would like to schedule one, please contact Maureen Evans. Thank you to everyone who has welcomed our Campaign Ambassadors so far!

Our goal is to have pledges returned by May 15<sup>th</sup> so we can wrap up the Campaign at a special celebration on Sunday, June 3.

#### Did you know?

Individuals age 70 1/2 and older can make a qualified charitable distribution from their IRA as a distribution for purposes of the Required Minimum Distribution rules. These qualified distributions are made directly to the church by your IRA trustee and not subject to Federal income tax. You should always consult your own financial advisor to understand your particular circumstances before making a gift from your assets.

#### Can I designate my Capital Campaign gift for a particular project?

Unfortunately, no. Our church policies strongly discourage designated/restricted gifts, in part because it is very difficult for the church to administer those gifts and make sure that every penny of any one particular gift gets spent on any one specific project. And, if a project ends up being less than the restricted gift amount, the church cannot use the remaining funds for something else and the money is left unused.

We hope that people appreciate that the Capital Campaign is about all of us coming together to take care of the needs of the whole church, and ensuring that Our Future – and that of those who follow us - is the best it can be. Rest assured that much work and care has gone into assessing our church's capital needs, listening to input from the entire congregation, seeking expert advice, setting priorities, and developing project plans that make the most of our precious resources. Every Campaign gift gets us closer to reaching our base goal of \$822,000 and our stretch goal of \$1.09 million—and then ALL the projects can be completed!
