
Simon Sez...

During the Lenten season, a group of us read Eric Elnes' book, "Phoenix Affirmations: A New Vision for the Future of Christianity." It is a deeply theological book that grounds us in the historic Christian tradition and presents us with a path to living our faith in the 21st Century. It recognizes that the Holy Spirit leads and shapes churches, in every generation, into new life. The third affirmation is "Celebrating the God whose Spirit pervades and whose glory is reflected in all of God's Creation, including the earth and its ecosystems, the sacred and secular, the Christian and non-Christian, the human and non-human." Here the distinction between the physical and spiritual, the sacred and the secular are intertwined together.

One of the reasons why I wanted to move here is for Vermont's mountains. Wisconsin does not have any. We have beautiful rolling hills and forests. I first saw mountains in person when I went to Denver for an alternative spring break trip to help build Habitat for Humanity houses. But it was not until I lived in Santa Fe, NM for me to venture out to hike mountains. Yes, Santa Fe's mountains are significantly taller than here.

Hiking in the mountains and in the wooded forest brings me a sense of peace and calm. There is a physical and spiritual process taking place within me. I experience the wonder of creation: aroma, touch, sound. The swooshing sound of the wind blowing through the trees or crashing against the rocks. My body responds to the physical exertion that then releases feel-good chemicals and my memory reminds me God's spirit is like the wind and, like the wind, has shaped the very landscape of nature. And from Great is Thy Faithfulness, I sing, "Summer and winter, springtime and harvest sun, moon and stars in their courses above. Join with all nature in manifold witness. To Thy great faithfulness, mercy and love." And in that moment, the physical and spiritual come alive within me. It is an act of praise and giving glory to the divine.

How long do your Easter decorations stay up? Have you ever thought about Easter as a season? On the church calendar Easter is not just a day. There is the season of Eastertide which lasts for 50 days until we arrive on Pentecost Sunday. Some call it the time of resurrection. We celebrate with so much joy on Easter Sunday, the first Sunday of Eastertide, but what about the other 6 Sunday of Eastertide? Well, this year on the 2nd Sunday we continued to celebrate as it was our 10th Anniversary of being Open and Affirming. We have new rainbow paraments that are hanging up front in the Sanctuary. So, do you think we can keep this celebration going, in church, in our hearts, with others we meet? When you sit down with your family, or chat with them on the phone, talk about what it would look like for you to celebrate all 50 days of Eastertide. (Remember in Lent we didn't count the Sundays as part of the 40 days, in Eastertide we count them. Can you figure out why?) What would 50x as much joy look like for your family? For you? How might you reach out and continue the celebration of God's love for everyone and what Jesus's resurrection means to you? When Pentecost arrives on June 5th this year we will be welcoming the Holy Spirit with our confirmation class leading the worship service that morning. We will also give thanks for all those who have helped our children and youth programs this year and then enjoy some ice cream. A wonderful celebration of welcoming the Holy Spirit among us, hearing the story and being together as a community of faith. So, between now and then, what ways can you continue celebrating the risen Christ in your life? At our Good Friday service we were asked to write down an action that one could take that might lead to positive changes in our world. We then walked them forward and put them into a basket. At the end of the service we each took one from the basket, hopefully not to take our own. The paper I selected said, 'smile at or compliment someone you wouldn't usually'. This is one of the ways I will celebrate the Easter joy throughout this Easter season. Feel free to use this one and think of more ways to celebrate the risen Christ among us.


