Your Pastor's Ponderings......

By now all of you probably know that our talented and beloved Christian Education Director, Laurie Chipman, will be leaving us and retiring to New York State to be closer family. She loves her family but she has also grown to love the people and programs of FCCEJ. She has poured her energy and heart into making our Faith Formation Program for Children and Youth the best one in the state of Vermont. For years, she has been the point person and convener of all the Vermont Christian Educators in the state and the others look to Laurie for guidance and expertise. We have been incredibly blessed to have Laurie on staff for so long.

Due to Laurie's love of our church and her investment in our Faith Formation & Youth Ministry Programs, she has gifted us with a new way of leaving. Instead of making a clean break and having a sudden gap in our staff and programming, she has offered to transition more slowly so that a new person can come on board and learn the ropes before Laurie is completely gone. The old style abrupt departure usually leaves churches floundering for a bit as the new replacements figure out how the program works. Laurie wants our program to flourish and continue on in a healthy way even during a transition, so as new staff are hired, Laurie will slowly cut back her hours and stay on board to guide the new folks and share her expertise.

With Laurie working with our Human Resource Committee, we have decided to start advertising in August for the new 6th - 12th grade Youth Ministry Educator, hoping for a start date in January 2025. This person will join Elizabeth Miller, Children's Ministry Coordinator, in working with the young people in our faith community. Laurie plans to stay for six weeks of transition after their hire date and help them settle in.

Since we don't have an exact hire date, Laurie has agreed to be a little flexible as to how long she will stay, but she does plan to depart before Easter 2025. That gives HRC and Church Council a little wiggle room in the hiring process.

Once the new person is hired, then we plan one heck of a party to celebrate Laurie's fifteen years of incredible ministry here. We will plan a fun party with gifts and speeches and maybe even a little light roasting! We will laugh and cry as we remember all the good times and significant events in which Laurie has participated. More of the details will be forthcoming.

For now, enjoy Laurie and the many gifts she brings to the church. Tell her how much you have appreciated her leadership, and share a story of her that you remember. Together we will celebrate and grieve, laugh and embrace, and together we will know that we have been blessed.

Enjoy the summer and I'll see you in August.

Our Youth Ministry Team has been working hard organizing these fun days of hands-on service for our youth. Junior & Senior High Youth can sign up for one day or all four days, or if they have a summer job and are not sure they can participate I ask that they please reach out to me, as I'm sure we can figure something out so that they can spend some time in service. Our days will begin here at church, anywhere from 8am to 8:30am, and we will return here at the end of our day. Parents can drop off their youth and then YM Team will transport the group to our off-site locations. Participating youth need to have a YM Family Registration form all filled out (one form per family), along with a Parent/Guardian Permission Slip/Signed Waiver for the VT Food Bank on gleaning days. Both have a deadline of a week beforehand.

On Wednesday, July 17th, we will help with the VT Food Bank delivery here at FCCEJ—bright and early at 8am. We will then transition to baking goodies in our kitchen that we will later deliver to an organization after lunch. We are still finalizing where that will be for the afternoon, along with hoping to end our day helping out the Heavenly Thrift Shop.

After gathering here on Thursday, July 18 morning, we will travel to Burlington Interval where we will glean for the VT Food Bank, then have lunch and hope to help out at Spectrum or another location in the afternoon.

On Wednesday, July 24 we will arrive at church for an activity, then travel to go gleaning for the VT Food Bank, stop for lunch and return to church and make part of the meal for the Dismas House dinner that evening. We would like to coordinate with whoever signs up for the other meal items and would be willing to take the dinner to Dismas.

Thursday, July 25 begins by helping the volunteers get things ready for the Heavenly Food Pantry distribution day. We are working out the plans for the rest of the day but very well may end up at Mansfield Place playing board games with the residents.

Vacation Bible Camp, August 5-9, is the other main program that is keeping me busy these days. Many of you have stepped up to volunteer your time, thank you. We have campers who are registered, and we are hoping for more. The majority so far are staying for the full day. We do need a few more afternoon Senior High or College aged to work the afternoon of camp week. If you, your youth, or someone you know might be interested, please be in touch. I will be scheduling a couple of times for the JH youth and staff to gather in July so we can put a few pieces of the set together and have a small training session about camp week.

I pray you are finding ways to connect with our God through nature, people, volunteering, worshiping and setting some time aside to just be and listen for the breath of God to speak to you.

Heavenly Cents Thrift Shop News!

Happy Summer! Thrift Shop customers have been delighted with our Spring/Summer inventory and we continue to see an increase in customer traffic and sales. Due to our increasing sales, in June we were able to donate \$19,500 to the community. \$1,500 was given to each of the following organizations: Building Bright Futures, Champlain Community Services, EJRP Scholarship Fund, Janet S. Munt Family Room, Jenna's Promise, Let's Grow Kids, National Alliance of Mental Health VT, Project Hoeppner, HomeShare Vermont, Vermont Children's Trust Foundation, Stern Center for Language and Learning, Vermont Community Fund and Hunger Free Vermont.

We also spruced up the porch at the shop with the installation of new carpet. The Thrift Shop is also working with the Food Pantry to support the Milk Project. We appreciate our generous community members who make donations, so we may continue to meet our mission of serving others, both with sale items and financial donations to local organizations.

We constantly explore ways to reuse and recycle items donated that we cannot sell, with a goal of keeping the clothing waste in our community and we reach out to folks who reuse and recycle. We continue to take the unsold denim (jeans) to Outerknown, a recycling/reuse business in St. Albans. We appreciate the support our community at large provides and always welcome donations of gently used items in good resalable quality. We are open for shopping and receiving donations on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-1, and Wednesday evenings from 4-7pm. Being open on the first Sunday of the month will resume in the fall.

Chili Grab-n-Go Fundraiser

The Missions Committee is holding a Chili Grab-n-Go Dinner on Friday September 20th. The committee will be asking church members to make meat or vegetarian chili and corn bread. Watch for sign-ups in early September. The dinner will benefit the Age Well Meals on Wheels program. The following is information on this program: Meals on Wheels ensures that older Vermonters can remain in their own homes and avoid far more costly healthcare alternatives, such as unnecessary trips to the emergency room, hospitalizations, and nursing home placements. For many aging Vermonters, trusted Age Well volunteers or staff members who show up every day with a meal and a warm smile is the only person they see or speak with all day. This special delivery is the reason to get up in the morning, something to look forward to, and a reminder to take good care of themselves. Adequate nutrition is a necessity for health, functionality, and the ability to remain independent. Healthy eating can increase energy levels, mental acuity, resistance to illness and disease, immune system strength, recuperation speed, and the ability to manage chronic health problems. Our meal programs ensure that aging Vermonters have access to adequate nutrition even when family support, mobility, and resources are lacking. From a recent Participant Survey, 88% report they eat healthier food because of Meals on Wheels.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. Do I have to use the printed and numbered pledge envelopes?
 - A. No. If you are paying your pledge by check, nothing else is needed, and the check can be deposited loose in the collection plate. If you are paying with cash, please use a plain envelope with your name on it.
- Q. Do I need to pay my pledge weekly?
 - A. No. Your pledge can be paid on whatever schedule best fits your financial situation. It can be weekly, monthly, quarterly, or any other way you choose. This includes automatic payments from your bank.
- Q. Can I make one annual pledge payment?
 - A. Yes. An annual pledge can be paid in one lump sum at any time during the year.
- Q. If I'm gone for two months, should I put the missed pledge payments into separate envelopes when I return?

 A. No. It is not necessary to put the payments for the missed weeks into eight individual envelopes. One envelope with the total amount pledged for the missed weeks is sufficient.
- Q. Can I write one check and split the amount between pledge and special offerings?
 - A. Yes. Writing one check is fine as long as it is indicated in the memo line or on an attached note how the total amount should be split.
- Q. Do you need my member number to credit my account with my payments?
 - A. No. Member accounts can be accessed in the church database by either member number or name.
- Q. I have money from a fund raising event. What should I do with it?
 - A. The money should be counted by two people. The amount should be written on a paper and the paper signed by the counters. The money and the signed paper are then placed in an envelope or a bank bag (there are bank bags over the safe which is in the closet across from the administrative offices). Be sure to indicate which fund raising event and deposit in the safe ASAP after the event.
- Q. Can I donate appreciated stocks?
 - A. Yes. It's easy, and a simplified way for tax deduction. Additional information on making a stock donation is on the FCCEJ website (Giving / Ways to Donate / Make a Gift of Stock).

Craft Fest Annual Lawn Sale

Items can be dropped off the morning of the sale, starting at 7am at the church. Please note if you bring any furniture and it doesn't sell, you will be responsible for picking it up. The committee doesn't have the resources to bring to other thrift stores.

The lawn sale will include a bake sale sponsored by the Missions Committee. All proceeds from the bake sale will go to JUMP. Founded in 1988, the Joint Urban Ministry Project (JUMP) addresses the growing epidemic of poverty. To date, support for JUMP has grown to include broad interfaith assistance from 27 faith communities in the local area, key funding from hundreds of individuals, and vital sponsorship and dollars from both businesses and foundations. Unwavering, JUMP operates a key downtown Drop-In Center in donated space at the First Congregational Church of Burlington, where staff and volunteers provide compassionate care, practical assistance and informed referrals to thousands of Vermont children and adults. Eligible families and individuals receive voucher assistance for transportation, food, laundry, utilities, household goods, and healthcare every three months.
